The meeting was called to order by President T. Wipperfurth on August 30, 2022 at 4:15 P.M. All public notices have been posted to meet with the open meeting law and the building is accessible for the handicapped.

Approval of Agenda 8-30-22: M. Killian made a motion to approve 8-30-22 agenda. R. LaPlante seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.

Approval of Minutes 7-26-22 Meeting: R. LaPlante made a motion to approve the minutes for the 7-26-22 meeting; T. Wipperfurth seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.

Agenda Item #4: Review C. Akey Sick Time/ Health Insurance Benefit Payout: After a brief discussion the board agreed that a pay out of the balance left on sick time would be the best option for C. Agenda Item #10: Informational/Correspondence: W. Peters informed the board that he drafted letters to the town boards of Minocqua, Arbor Vitae and Woodruff in regards to the American Rescue Plan Act. Letter content as follows:

Dear Town of Board Members,
It has been brought to our attention that the Town of received funding from the America Rescue Plan Act. Originally those funds were supposed to go towards the infrastructure of water, wastewater, and internet services to communities. The Lakeland Sanitary District #1 sent a letter to the Town of board asking about the funds received and what the District could count on to help improve our water and wastewater infrastructure to better serve our community. We did not receive any response from the Board nor any funds that the town received from the American Rescue Plan Act.
As you may or may not know, treating wastewater should be considered one of <i>THE</i> most important services to any community. By treating wastewater properly and efficiently the District is protecting the land, rivers, and lakes as well as the health and well being of the entire community. That being said the District is asking the Town of to know how much funding the town received from the American Rescue Plan Act. Also, what was the funding spent on if not for water and wastewater infrastructure? The District would also like to know why, as the Town Board of, you decided that not even a portion of these funds could be allocated to help improve the infrastructure of the water and wastewater services? And we would also like to know, why as the Town of board members, you decided that not allocating any funds to the District was more important than the health and well being of the community at large?
